









Decisions taken

A 4pm, the meeting got underway. The CDC convenor first read the minutes of the last meeting, which took place on February 25, 2022, before moving on to the agenda. The NAAC visit will be anticipated after the completion of the ongoing civil construction, which is to be finished before March 2022, and the principal discussed how to use the CDC matching grant for 2020-2021 and effectively complete the campus beautification. The prior minutes submitted by the principal and CDC convenor were accepted and approved by the committee following a thorough debate.

- 1) The Director of Collegiate Education sanctioned an amount of Rupees 1,77,500/- as the share of the Government for the academic year 2017-18

a equal share from the student, and a total of Rupees 37.6,000/- (Three Lakh Seventy Six Thousand only) as the coc matching grant for this time period in accordance with order No-01/2022, dated 06/11/22. The principal gave an explanation of the proposal adopted by the College Council for using the aforementioned matching grant.

2) The college campus is now experiencing a severe water scarcity. Water is now available via the Keerla Water Authority, a open well and a bore well. But from January to May, open wells and bore wells dry up, KWA water pressure is insufficient and water is only available two or three days a week at late-night hours. Therefore, it's imperative to have a backup water supply. A location that is convenient for that has been found in the campus near to the check dam of the Keerla University campus. Therefore, it is crucial to build an open well together with the required plumbing and power facilities connected to the new sump built by the KIIFB project.

3) The college council has also recommended adding a waste disposal facility, replacing the old coolers with new ones, and installing napkin vending machines. The committee chose to address the issue of inadequate water supply first after a thorough debate. The committee unanimously decided to build an open well along with the necessary plumbing and motor facilities to transport water from the well to the sump, with alternative proposals to be taken into consideration at a later date.

Through tender procedures, every work will be completed in accordance with government regulations.

The meeting concluded at 5.15 pm.
