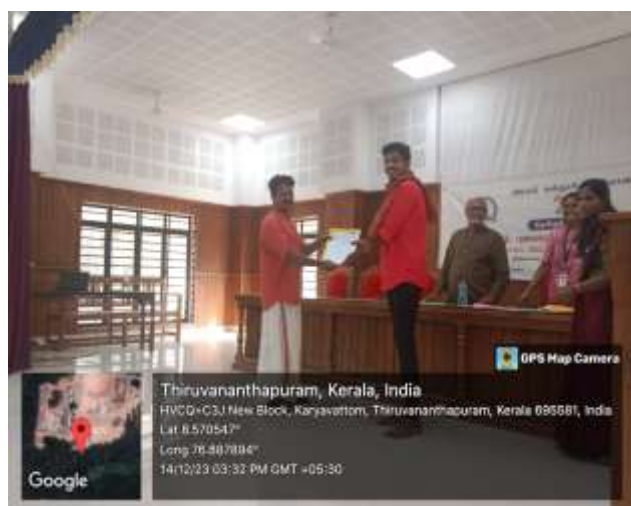


Session 3 : A comparative study of Tamil and Malayalam Neithal land Novels by Dr.Prabakaran, K.
