The program, held at the college seminar hall, featured Dr. Anju, Assistant Professor from Government Law College, Thiruvananthapuram, as the guest speaker.

Dr. Sandhia A, Principal of Government College Kariavattom, presided over the session. The coordinator of the program, Asha S, Assistant Professor of Chemistry, warmly welcomed the participants. Dr. Radhika A, Associate Professor of Biochemistry and IQAC convenor extended felicitations to the program. Teaching and non-teaching staff, as well as students,

actively participated in the program. Dr. Anju's talk provided a comprehensive understanding of the legal framework surrounding sexual harassment.

Key Focus Areas:

- Legal Definition of Sexual Harassment: Dr. Anju explained the legal definition of sexual harassment as outlined by the POSH Act (Prevention of Sexual Harassment at Workplace Act, 2013) and its applicability within educational institutions.
- **Types of Sexual Harassment:** The talk delved into various forms of sexual harassment, including verbal, physical, non-verbal, and visual harassment, along with relevant examples for clear understanding.
- **Complaint Procedures:** Dr. Anju shed light on the proper channels for reporting sexual harassment incidents, including the Internal Complaints Committee (ICC) and external bodies like law enforcement.
- **Rights of Victims and Bystanders:** The session empowered participants by outlining the legal rights available to victims of sexual harassment, along with the role and responsibilities of bystanders in preventing and reporting such incidents.

An interactive session followed the talk, allowing participants to clarify doubts and gain further insights on specific legal aspects. This interactive forum fostered open communication and encouraged participants to become active agents in preventing sexual harassment. The programme was concluded by vote of thanks by Dr. Karthika Krishnan, Assistant Professor of geography.
